

Guidelines (Updated on April 3, 2023)

Number of Turners and Skippers

Judging Notes:

1. Judges should use the “Marking Sheet for Number of Skippers” to count the number of turners and skippers in each routine. At the end, judges should calculate the average number of skippers in the 5 different components, respectively.
2. A New Routine means:
2.1 Decrease in number of turners and/or skippers.
2.2 The Change in Components. (i.e., Single Rope, Partners Skills, Double Dutch, Long Ropes / Multiple Ropes, Traveler)
3. ***The maximum number of turners and skippers is 14.***
4. In all routines, if some of the skippers make mistakes, Judges should not treat it as a new routine immediately, even if there is a decrease in skippers. Judges should treat it as a new routine only if the skippers have no intention of joining in again.
5. In traveler skills, all the skippers performing those traveler skills should be counted, but not only those skippers who jump over the rope each time.
6. If more than one component is executing at the same time or if the ‘performing units’ are not identical, no score should be counted.
7. The Final score for the Number of Skippers is the sum of the average number of skippers in the 5 different components, multiplied by 4/14, depending on the maximum number of skippers in the corresponding category. A maximum mark is 20.
